



## **PHILIP S. JOHNSON**

Philip S. Johnson is Chief Patent Counsel for Johnson & Johnson, having joined the corporation in January 2000 after 27 years in private practice serving clients including Johnson & Johnson. In this position, he oversees about 100 patent attorneys in the US & Europe, and advises Johnson & Johnson's top management on patent matters relating to its 200 plus operating companies worldwide.

Phil is currently the Chair of the Board of Directors of the American Intellectual Property Law Education Fund, President of INTERPAT (the international association of research based pharmaceutical Chief Patent Counsel), Chair of the PhRMA's IP Focus Group, and Member of the Steering Committee of the Coalition for 21<sup>st</sup> Century Patent Reform. Phil also serves on the Board of Directors of the Intellectual Property Owners Association, the Board of the Intellectual Property Owners Education Foundation, and the National Advisory Board of the Monell Chemical Senses Center. He is immediate Past President of the Association of Corporate Patent Counsel

Before joining Johnson & Johnson, Phil was a senior partner and co-chair of litigation in the intellectual property law firm of Woodcock Washburn in Philadelphia, where he specialized in intellectual property issues affecting major pharmaceutical, medical device and consumer product companies. Phil has served as trial counsel in over 100 patent cases, including over 50 resulting in reported decisions of the federal district courts and/or of the Federal Circuit Court of Appeals.

Phil is a frequent speaker, and has testified before both the House and Senate Judiciary Committees on the subject of patent law reform.

Phil received his Bachelor of Science degree, cum laude with distinction in biology from Bucknell University and his J.D. degree from Harvard Law School, where his third year advisor was now-Supreme Court Justice Stephen Breyer.
